Pupils attending Grammar Schools or High Schools (excluding those in Preparatory Departments), who travel to School by rail, bus or cycle.

Dear Sir or Madam,

I should be glad if you would kindly note -

- (1) If pupils attending Grammar Schools or High Schools reside more than three miles from the School attended by them and ~~travel by rail~~ to the town in which the School is situated, the pupil's railway season ticket for the term should be purchased by the parent (or guardian) and the Education Committee will refund the cost, if the pupil tells the Head Master or Head Mistress of the School the cost of the ticket.
- (2) If pupils attending Grammar Schools or High Schools reside more than three miles from the School attended by them and travel by a service bus to the town in which the School is situated, the pupil's bus season ticket for the term will be handed, free of charge, to the pupil by the conductor on the bus.
- (3) If pupils attending Grammar Schools or High Schools reside more than three miles from the School attended by them and travel by a contract bus to the town in which the School is situated, no tickets will be issued to the pupils and no charge will be made to the parents or guardians.
- (4) (a) If pupils attending Grammar Schools or High Schools reside more than three miles from the School attended by them and cycle to School, the Education Committee will pay the parent (or guardian) of the pupil a cycling allowance at the rate of 10/- per term.
(b) If pupils attending Grammar Schools or High Schools reside more than three miles from the railway station and cycle to the station, or if pupils attending Grammar Schools or High Schools reside more than three miles from the point at which they board the service bus or contract bus, and cycle to that point, the Education Committee will pay the parent (or guardian) of the pupil a cycling allowance at the rate of 10/- per term.

The Head Master or Head Mistress of the School will be able to tell the pupil which of the above methods of travelling the pupil should use in order to reach the School.
